As Mathematicians we will practise counting up to 20 objects; compare and order numbers to 20; count forwards and backwards to 100; recall all pairs of numbers with a total of 20 and addition facts for totals within 10.

As Scientists we will find out about the human body. We will be learning about the different features of the human body and what each feature is used for. We will also plan and take part in an experiment involving the 5 senses.

As writers, we will use full stops and capital letters to show a sentence.
As readers, we will read a range of stories and information texts. We will read sight words, find key ideas in a text and say what we like about the books we read.
