In Literacy, we will be reading the traditional tale of Beowulf, as well as other myths and legends, writing our own tales based on what we have read. We will also use our scientific knowledge of how the ear works to write comprehensive explanation texts.

In Art & Design this half term we will be looking at weaving techniques and how they have developed through the ages, creating a practical example.

As musicians, our focus we will be on notation and performance, using recorders as our primary instrument.

In PE we will be begin to develop our control of rackets and learn the techniques and skills needed to effectively participate in a game of tennis.

In Humanities we will be looking at the history and origins of the Anglo Saxons, including Alfred the Great, using artifacts and images to answer questions and identifying changes over time. We will learn about the key historical events of the Anglo Saxon period and the effect these events had on people.
