Writing an Extended Adventure Story

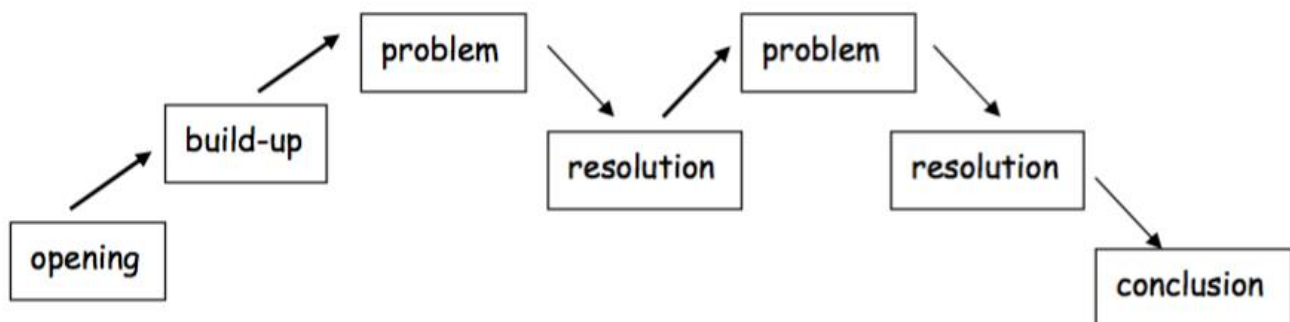


An adventure story can take you to a far away land, your journey can be full of action, perils and problems to solve.

An adventure story can involve a long journey, travelling using a variety of transport types (canoe, aeroplane, hot air balloon), encountering lost tribes of people, trekking through jungles. There can be many perils along the way. Indiana Jones and The Famous Five are examples of adventure stories.

An extended story can have 2 or 3 problems and resolutions, before the story comes to an end.

It could look like this:



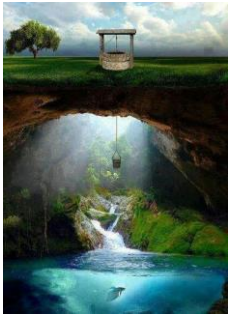
Plan and write an adventure story. Use the ideas given or make up your own. Use

<p>Introduction: Who is/are your character(s)? What's the setting? How is it going to start?</p>		
<p>Begin your adventure: where are you going? How are you getting there? What will you do there? Why are you going there?</p>		
<p>Problem: what issue(s) do you face on this journey? Why/how? What characters do you meet?</p>		
<p>Resolution: is this problem resolved? How is it resolved? If not, why not?</p>		
<p>Ending: How do you get back home and what does your character learn?</p>
