Communication and Language

We will be learning to:

- Develop social phrases.
- Engage in story times.
- Listen carefully to rhymes and songs, paying attention to how they sound.
- Engage in non-fiction books.



Literacy

We will be learning to:

- Read some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them.
- Read a few common exception words.
- Form lowercase and capital letters correctly.



Maths

We will be learning to:

- Count objects, actions and sounds.
- Link the number symbol (numeral) with its cardinal number value.
- Select, rotate and manipulate shapes in order to develop spatial reasoning skills.
- Continue, copy and create repeating patterns.



Physical Development

We will be learning to:

- Confidently and safely use a range of large and small indoor and outdoor apparatus, alone and in a group.
- Develop overall body strength, balance, coordination and agility.
- Further develop the skills we need to manage the school day successfully: lining up and queuing, mealtimes and personal hygiene.



Understanding the World

We will be learning to:

- Explore the natural world around us.
- Describe what we see, hear and feel whilst outside.
- Understand the effect of changing seasons on the natural world around us.



Expressive Art and Design

We will be learning to:

- Develop storylines in our pretend play.
- Create our own songs, or improvise a song around one we know.



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be learning to:

- Show resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge.
- Identify and moderate our own feelings socially and emotionally.
- Think about the perspectives of others.
- Manage our own needs.
