Feedback of running of class council sessions.	<p>What is going well with class council sessions?</p> <p>Year 3: <i>Children have talk partner time so they can discuss the questions first before sharing.</i></p> <p>Year 4: <i>The minutes are filled in well so it makes it easier for us when we bring the folder to school council.</i></p> <p>Year 6: <i>We use lolly sticks to encourage all children to have the chance to share their ideas.</i></p>	
Feedback from class council	<p>Anti bullying</p> <p><u>What does bullying mean?</u></p> <p>Year 3: <i>When something unkind is done on purpose and happens over and over again.</i></p> <p>Year 4: <i>It's repeated unkindness.</i></p> <p>Year 5: <i>There is often a power dynamic – one person trying to show power/control over another person.</i></p> <p><u>What do we have in place to support anti-bullying?</u></p> <p>Year 4: <i>We know there are lots of adults in school who can help us. This includes our own class teachers as well as Ms Carr and Ms Stacey.</i></p> <p>Year 3: <i>We have anti-bullying days for examples – Odd Sock Day to raise awareness. We are also taught about anti-bullying in PSHE and this happens in every year group.</i></p> <p>Year 5: <i>We have problem and praise boxes in every classroom to encourage children to share any problems they may be having.</i></p> <p>Year 6: <i>We are encouraged to not be bystanders and to actively ensure bullying does not happen. The theme for anti-bullying week has been “make some noise” which reinforces this idea.</i></p> <p>Art</p> <p><u>What have you been learning about in Art this term/ How does this link to what you've learnt in previous Art lessons?</u></p> <p>Year 3: <i>We have been learning how to make weather weaves. We've developed blending skills to mix the colours for the background. We learnt about this in year 2 when we mixed paints for our Vincent Van Gogh sunflowers.</i></p> <p>Year 4: <i>Our unit is digital media. This has linked well with maths as we have been looking at measurements/angles.</i></p>	

	<p>Year 5: <i>This term, we have been learning about Andy Warhol and pop art. We are developing our painting skills (and how to use a sponge). We've improved our observation skills – especially when looking at pop art and discussing colour choices.</i></p> <p>Year 6: <i>We have been learning about eco-tapestries. This has linked well to world week – especially as the focus is on the environment.</i></p>
