Homework

- Learning their weekly spellings which will be set on Thursday and tested on the following Wednesday.

Our topic this half term is The Romans



Literacy

As Writers, we will be developing our skills as narrative writers, with a focus on creating mood. We be writing reports about The Romans as well as producing explanation texts.



Mathematics

As Mathematicians, we will be developing our knowledge of multiplication and division. We will also be developing our knowledge of time, looking at both analogue and digital time and calculating durations of time.



Science

As Scientists, we will be learning all about forces that act upon the world around us. We will be finding out about friction: both the positive and negative impact it can have on us. We will also be carrying out an investigation to find out the most suitable material for a 'Hot Wheels' race track!
