In the highly unusual situation, please be assured that the intention is to ensure that everyone remains safe.

Please support them with this by making sure that tasks are completed and children have the opportunity to read and talk about their learning at home. Knowing times tables is particularly helpful, along with telling the time on both analogue and digital clocks, counting money and of course sharing a book.


Attendance
