Dear Parents and Carers.

From creative posters and models to thoughtful writing and research, it's clear that a lot of effort and enthusiasm went into their work. Last of all, a few reminders about the warm weather as we move into the second half of the summer term. It is really important that children are taught to keep safe in the sun. Monday 7 th July	<u>Transitions:</u> How can I prepare my child for transition to Year 1? (Reception parents)


Attendance
