Fine Motor Skills

Fine motor skills involve the use of the muscles in the hands.

Fine motor skills often require coordinating movements of the hands and fingers with the eyes; this called hand-eye coordination.







What skills do fine motor skills include?

- Pencil skills (mark making, colouring, drawing, writing)
- Scissors skills
- Construction skills (using Lego, Duplo, puzzles, train tracks)
- Technology use (pressing buttons, tapping on keyboard).
- Dressing (tying shoelaces, zips, buttons, belts)
- > Eating (using cutlery, opening lunch boxes and food bags)
- Hygiene (cleaning teeth, brushing hair, toileting).

Gross Motor Skills and Handwriting

- Gross motor skills involve the large muscles of the arms, legs and torso.
- Good posture is required for good handwriting.
- Handwriting requires the larger muscle groups in the neck, shoulder and trunk to work together with appropriate force, timing and

action.



Child can tell you what they have written.








Pencil Grip and Control

the tripod grip.


















Early Learning Goal - Writing
